

Cheating (68%): Use of unauthorized assistance beyond those authorized by the instructor within assignments or examinations.

Plagiarism (32%): Copying or using the words, ideas or concepts of another without proper citation.

Consequences


Academic Judgment: The academic judgment for the offense is decided by the faculty member and is a separate action from the sanctions that may be imposed by the vice provost for Undergraduate Education.

Sanctions:

- a. No Sanction (1 students).
- b. Warning. A notice in writing to the student that the student is violating or has violated institutional regulations (16 students).
- c. Probation. A written reprimand for violation of specified regulations. Probation is for a designated period of time and includes the probability of more severe sanctions if the student is found to be violating any institutional regulation(s) during the probationary period (10 students).
- d. Loss of Privileges. Denial of specified privileges for a designated period of time.
- e. Discretionary Sanctions. Work assignments, service to the University, or other related discretionary (5 students).
- f. University Dismissal. An involuntary separation of the student from the institution for misconduct apart from academic requirements. It does not imply or state a minimum separation time.

- g. University Suspension. Separation of the student from the University for a definite period of time, after which the student is eligible to return. Conditions for readmission may be specified.
- h. University Expulsion. Permanent separation of the student from the University.

Cheating (56%): Use of unauthorized assistance beyond those authorized by the instructor within assignments or examinations.

Plagiarism (44%): Copying or using the words, ideas or concepts of another without proper citation.

Consequences

Academic Judgment: The academic judgment for the offense is decided by the faculty member and is a separate action from the sanctions that may be imposed by the vice provost for Undergraduate Education.

Sanctions:

- a. No Sanction (1 student).
- b. Warning. A notice in writing to the student that the student is violating or has violated institutional regulations (3 students).
- c. Probation. A written reprimand for violation of specified regulations. Probation is for a designated period of time and includes the probability of more severe sanctions if the student is found to be violating any institutional regulation(s) during the probationary period (19 students).
- d. Loss of Privileges. Denial of specified privileges for a designated period of time.
- e. Discretionary Sanctions. Work assignments, service to the University, or other related discretionary (21 students).
- f. University Dismissal. An involuntary separation of the student from the institution for misconduct apart from academic requirements. It does not imply or state a minimum separation time (1 student).

- g. University Suspension. Separation of the student from the University for a definite period of time, after which the student is eligible to return. Conditions for readmission may be specified.
- h. University Expulsion. Permanent separation of the student from the University.
