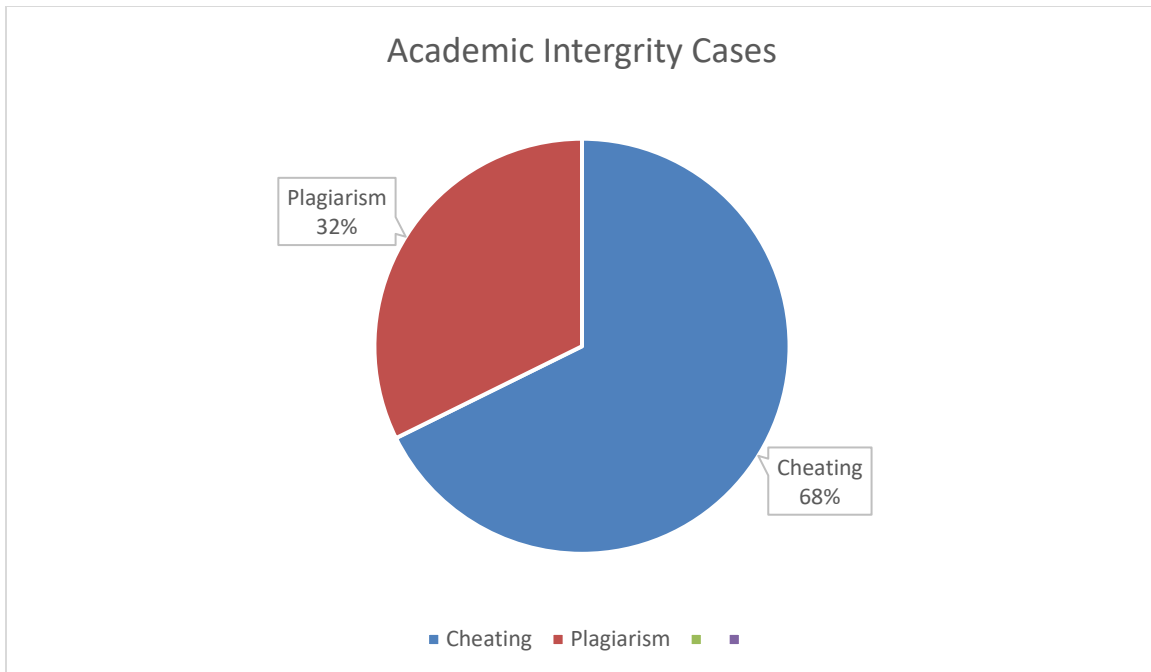

Academic Dishonesty  
31 reported cases**



**Cheating (68%):** Use of unauthorized assistance beyond those authorized by the instructor within assignments or examinations.

**Plagiarism (32%):** Copying or using the words, ideas or concepts of another without proper citation.

### Consequences

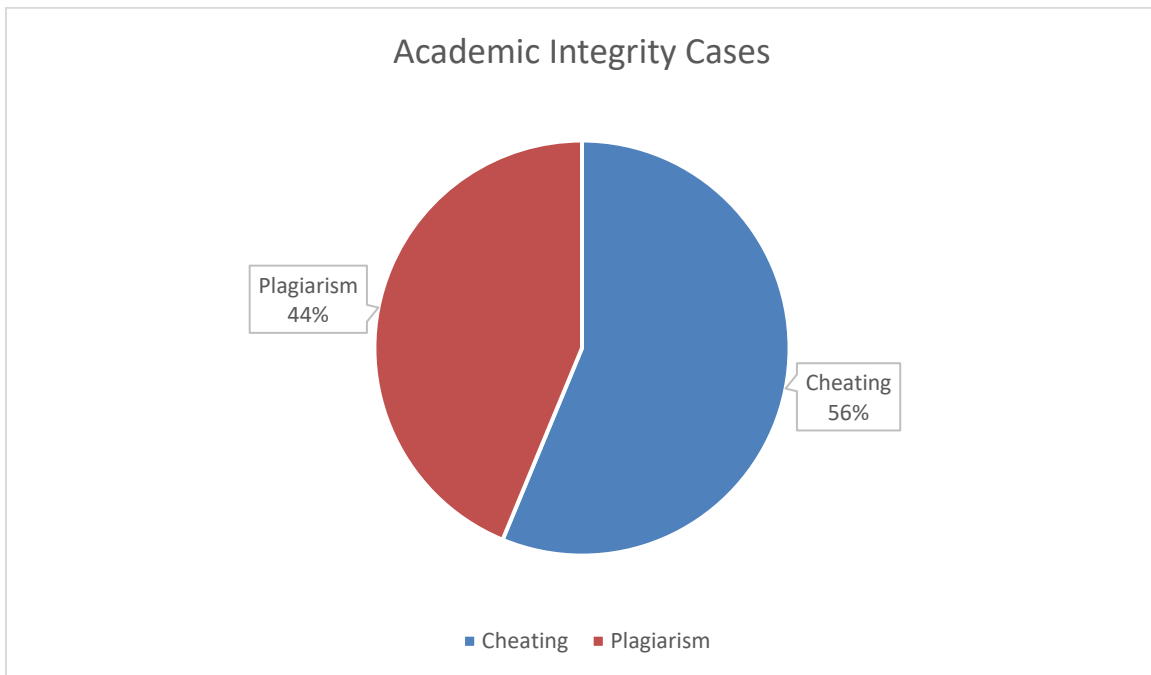
**Academic Judgment:** The academic judgment for the offense is decided by the faculty member and is a separate action from the sanctions that may be imposed by the vice provost for Undergraduate Education.

### Sanctions:

- a. No Sanction (**1 students**).
- b. Warning. A notice in writing to the student that the student is violating or has violated institutional regulations (**16 students**).
- c. Probation. A written reprimand for violation of specified regulations. Probation is for a designated period of time and includes the probability of more severe sanctions if the student is found to be violating any institutional regulation(s) during the probationary period (**10 students**).
- d. Loss of Privileges. Denial of specified privileges for a designated period of time.
- e. Discretionary Sanctions. Work assignments, service to the University, or other related discretionary (**5 students**).
- f. University Dismissal. An involuntary separation of the student from the institution for misconduct apart from academic requirements. It does not imply or state a minimum separation time.

- g. University Suspension. Separation of the student from the University for a definite period of time, after which the student is eligible to return. Conditions for readmission may be specified.
- h. University Expulsion. Permanent separation of the student from the University.

**Cheating (56%):** Use of unauthorized assistance beyond those authorized by the instructor within assignments or examinations.

**Plagiarism (44%):** Copying or using the words, ideas or concepts of another without proper citation.

### Consequences

**Academic Judgment:** The academic judgment for the offense is decided by the faculty member and is a separate action from the sanctions that may be imposed by the vice provost for Undergraduate Education.

### Sanctions:

- a. No Sanction (**1 student**).
- b. Warning. A notice in writing to the student that the student is violating or has violated institutional regulations (**3 students**).
- c. Probation. A written reprimand for violation of specified regulations. Probation is for a designated period of time and includes the probability of more severe sanctions if the student is found to be violating any institutional regulation(s) during the probationary period (**19 students**).
- d. Loss of Privileges. Denial of specified privileges for a designated period of time.
- e. Discretionary Sanctions. Work assignments, service to the University, or other related discretionary (**21 students**).
- f. University Dismissal. An involuntary separation of the student from the institution for misconduct apart from academic requirements. It does not imply or state a minimum separation time (**1 student**).

- g. University Suspension. Separation of the student from the University for a definite period of time, after which the student is eligible to return. Conditions for readmission may be specified.
- h. University Expulsion. Permanent separation of the student from the University.
