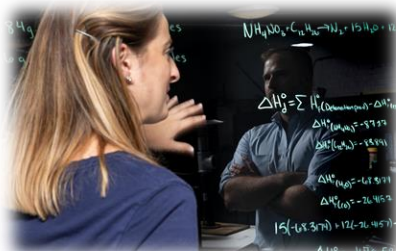

# Academic Dishonesty – What is included?

UMSystem - 200.010 Standard of Conduct

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# Cheating includes but is not limited to:

- > Use of ANY unauthorized assistance ...
- > Dependence upon the aid of sources beyond those authorized ...
- > Acquisition or possession without permission of tests or academic material ...
- > Knowingly providing any unauthorized assistance ...

# Plagiarism includes but is not limited to:

- > Use by paraphrase or direct quotation of the published or unpublished work of another without fully crediting the author ...
- > Unacknowledged use of materials prepared by another person ...
- > Unacknowledged use of original work/material produced through collaboration without release in writing by collaborators ...

# Sabotage includes but is limited to...

- > the unauthorized interference with, modification of, or destruction of the work or intellectual property of another member of the University community.



# Common Pitfalls for Students

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# When in Doubt, Work Independently.

- > Common Scenarios
  - Sharing documents, or use of the “file system”
  - Copying someone else’s work
  - Working in groups on individual projects
- > Student misunderstandings
  - “We worked on it together...”
  - “It’s just a small part...”
  - “I didn’t know...”
- > REMEMBER: It is your responsibility to ask what is considered as Academic Dishonesty in every class.
